## Ideas About Collecting and the Plastic Bag Ban

### from St. Mary's Food Pantry, Dumont



When churches closed in March of 2020 and donations could no longer be brought to mass or dropped at our rectory, we had to rethink how to collect and distribute donations safely.

The first step was how to collect, you can't distribute without collecting! Consequently, the drive through food donation was born! Our parishioners and other supporters drove up to the pantry door, a volunteer removed the bagged donations from the trunk or back seat of their car and off they went. Worked like a charm! This process has continued quarterly ever since May of 2020. There are times when people drop donations at the church or rectory, but very few. On drive through donation days, we have two sets of volunteers, one set bringing the donations to the pantry, usually the Confirmation candidates and youth group, and another sorting and bagging the donations. We try to bag three months of distributions at a time.

All food pantries are now faced, come November 4, with another collection and distribution issue due to the ban on single use plastic and paper bags. For now, we will be offering our parishioners single use bags at the doors of our church for their donations. (See photo below) Hopefully after November 4 we will still be able to offer paper bags for donations. If not, this topic will be revisited! For distribution, we will be using paper ream boxes or a comparable size. The pandemic has caused most of us to reinvent the way our pantries collect and distribute food.
