
The Reflection from Pastor Fr. John Carlos, Holy Cross Church, Harrison, NJ, November 15, 2020

YOU'VE GOT TALENT



The parable of the talents reminds us to use the "talents" that God has given us. Those who use their talents increase their skills, achieve success, and are rewarded. Those who do nothing with the gifts God has given them end up losing what they have been given.

While Sunday's Gospel could be interpreted as a motivational story, it takes on a different meaning when we ask ourselves who the "man going on a journey" might be. We come to know who he is when we realize that immediately after this parable, Jesus speaks about the Son of Man coming in glory to separate the sheep from the goats. Jesus is the man going on the journey. A journey that will encompass his passion, death, resurrection, and finally his ascension when he will leave to go back to the Father – but Jesus will return.

We are now in that "long time" as we wait for Jesus to return in glory. And we are the servants entrusted with "talents" by Jesus, our master.
