SUNDAY IS FAMILY-DAY



On the Sunday after Christmas, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Holy Family. We continue to celebrate the mystery of Christmas, opening up our contemplative horizon a bit more. Sunday and Christmas: are two realities to take into consideration in this Feast of the Holy Family.

Sunday, the Lord's Day, is the primary reason that brings us together to celebrate the Eucharist.

Sunday is the "family day", because it is the "day of the Lord", the "day of the man", the "day of the Church", as St. John Paul II told us in the Apostolic Letter "Dies Domini".

In the context of Christmas, this feast invites us to take a look at the Family of Jesus which becomes Holy. From this Family, we receive the familial warmth that we feel during the Christmas season. The Feast of the Holy Family is a perfect opportunity to reflect on our families and on the importance of family.
