Former classmates reflect on 50 years of priestly service

e's a very good cook," Rev. Msgr. Edward G. Bradley noted about his fellow priest and housemate Father William J. Melillo.

"I mostly do the broiling. I'm good with steak," Rev. Msgr. Michael E. Kelly added.

The three former classmates at Seton Hall University have lived together for almost 30 years at Seton House in West Orange. This year, they each celebrate 50 years of priesthood.

"We have a good house" Fr. Melillo explained. "We never fight. There might be disagreements at the dinner table, but we all get along."

They convivially refer to each other as "Eddie," "Billy" and "Mike," with their comradery serving as an example of the vocation.

"That's what the priesthood is,"

Fr. Melillo said. "There's this unspeakable bond that we all share."

"We are very supportive of each other and we encourage one another," Msgr. Kelly added.

Not only do the priests live together, they have served Seton Hall Preparatory School for decades. An alumnus of the school, Msgr. Kelly was first assigned as a teacher there in 1966. Throughout the years, he has served as coach, guidance counselor, headmaster and is currently the school's president.

For 12 years, Fr. Melillo was a teacher at Prep before serving as a guidance counselor there from 1989-2006. Like Msgr. Kelly, Msgr. Bradley's first assignment after his ordination was at the school where he taught subjects including Latin. theology and psychology until 2009.

Being around young people at Seton Hall Prep keeps the older priests vibrant, Msgr. Kelly believes.

"I enjoy going to games, school plays and just being with the kids.

Just being present makes a major impression on the students and parents," he said. "The kids still relate to us, even though we've been here for so long."

Along with sharing a house together, all three share a similar journey to the priesthood.

As a sophomore at Fairfield University, Msgr. Kelly knew that "God was asking" him to join the vocation. After speaking with parish priests and praying for clarity,

Two Montclair parishes to merge this fall

MONTCLAIR-Our Lady of Mount Carmel and Immaculate Conception will merge to form Saint Teresa of Calcutta Parish in September, members from the Archdiocese of Newark's New Energies Implementation Team told parishioners on May 17. The new parish will be located on Immaculate Conception's campus on North Fullerton Ave.

The merger comes after months of review against the 28 principles of the New Energies Parish Initiative and team members stressed the decision centered not on finances, but

rather on a dramatic decline in the visible signs of faith life in the parish.

During the past 20 years, for example, the number of registered families at Our Lady of Mount Carmel declined by almost half – from 765 to 393. Similarly, total numbers of parishioners fell from 2,303 in 1995 to 760 in 2015. Total attendance at all Sunday Masses dropped from 671 in 1995 to 222 in 2015.

By comparison, the number of families at Immaculate Conception parish grew from 1,100 in 1995 to 1,186 in 2015. Although the number of registered parishioners at Immaculate Conception also saw a decline since 1995 (from 3,000 to 2,200), the rate of decline was not as precipitous as at Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Similarly, Sunday Mass attendance at Immaculate Conception also declined, from 875 to 537 but again the decline was not as steep as at Our Lady of Mount Carmel.

In terms of sacramental life, the number of baptisms at Mount Carmel has fallen from 35 in 1995 to 8 in 2015. Similarly, First Communions fell by half during the past 20 years,

from 15 to 7. Confirmations saw a steep decline between 1995 and 2015 - from 21 to 2 - and marriages in the parish fell from 15 in 1995 to 1 in 2015. Only 20 children took part in religious education programs in the parish last year.

Immaculate Conception's sacramental life has remained robust with 48 baptisms, 51 First Communions, 31 Confirmations, 19 marriages in 2015, and more than 300 children participating in the parish's religious education programs.

As expected, there was visible tension and opposition to the announcement at both parishes. At

Hispanics to lead archdiocesan evangelization effort

astoral leaders throughout the Archdiocese of Newark are laying plans for their participation in the V Encuentro (Fifth Encounter), a four-year, Hispanic-led time of national renewal and evangelization in the Church.

"It's about encounter, not a program or conference, but an encounter with the risen Christ, with each other and with the Spirit," said Bishop Nelson Perez, who chairs the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops subcommittee on Hispanic Affairs.

The formation of the subcommittee was an outgrowth of the first Encuentro in 1972, and the others were held beginning in 1975, 1982 and 2000.

Bishop Perez, who grew up in Hudson County and is now an auxiliary in the Diocese of Rockville Center, NY, on June 1 addressed representatives of more than 30 archdiocesan parishes and groups already preparing for the local Encuentro.

During the session at the Archdiocesan Center, Bishop Perez said the four-year process involves "reflection and action for all Catholics through the prism of the Hispanic church." The ultimate objective is to call all U.S. Catholics to become "authentic and joyful missionaries who give witness to God's love in a culturally diverse Church."

He said the Hispanic perspective is offered at a time as those with roots in more than 20 Latin countries already comprise 51 percent of U.S. Catholics under the age of 25 and are headed to become the predominant ethnic group in the U.S. Church.

More than 20 representatives from parishes in Hudson, Bergen, Essex and Union counties, as well as from ecclesial movements and archdiocesan offices have already begun planning, said Deacon Asterio Velasco, coordinator of the Hispanic Apostolate for the archdiocese.

The next step is for information and training sessions for leaders to be scheduled in the fall, followed by

parish Encuentros next year, along with an archdiocesan Encuentro in fall 2017. In 2018, dioceses in New Jersey and Pennsylvania will convene a regional Encuentro, followed by the national Encuentro in September in Texas.

"What will it bring out? We don't know," Newark Auxiliary Bishop Manuel A. Cruz said. "We'll see what gift the Spirit leaves with us when it's all done."

"This is not an event that happens and disappears," Deacon Velasco said, explaining that a follow-up and implementation process continues through 2020.

But it all begins locally and that is the first, important step, Deacon Velasco added. "You are the doorkeepers," he told attendees. "If you open the door it will work."

Mount Carmel, parishioners focused on their long historical life and their ethnic and cultural faith traditions. Rev. Msgr. William Harms, who led the meeting at Mount Carmel, advised the parishioners that those traditions would be welcomed at the newly formed parish. The current pastor of Immaculate Conception, Father Joseph Scarangella, who has been named administrator of Mount Carmel, ensured that all of the numerous devotions and expressions of faith would continue.

At Immaculate Conception, parishioners expressed their willingness to make the people of Mount Carmel feel welcome and incorporate their heritage into the parish. Some members of both communities objected that no advance notice of the changed conditions in the parishes had ever been given, and no attempts had been made to increase numbers of parishioners or sacraments.

It was highlighted during both presentations that when New Energies launched in 2002, all archdiocesan parishes were encouraged to engage in conversations and make changes to invigorate the sparks of spiritual life. After initial changes in some parish configurations in 2007, parishes were again notified to continually review their parish experience and to seek ways to promote a strong, growing and vital sacramental and faith life.

As with other mergers within the Archdiocese of Newark over the past decade under New Energies, a new name is given to the merged parish as a sign of a new life for that community.

In the case of the Montclair parishes, the new name chosen – Saint

Teresa of Calcutta – was selected to recognize not only the new parish community, but also to offer as their patron the newest saint in the Catholic Church.

The merger will take effect on Sept. 4, the day Saint Teresa will be canonized at Saint Peter's Basilica in Rome.

In the weeks leading up to the establishment of Saint Teresa of Calcutta parish, New Energies Implementation Team members will continue to work with Our Lady of Mount Carmel and Immaculate Conception parishes to make the transition to this new community as inclusive and vibrant as possible.

Msgr. Guarino honored by Pope Francis

ope Francis has elevated Rev. Msgr. Thomas G. Guarino, a long-time theology professor at Immaculate Conception Seminary School of Theology, to the rank of "chaplain to his holiness," a rare honor in this papacy.

Msgr. Guarino was recommended for the papal honor by Archbishop John J. Myers, who presented the Vatican documents during Evening Prayer with the priest community at Seton Hall University, on May 16.

The honor was in recognition of Msgr. Guarino's "many scholarly theological works and more than three decades of teaching at our Immaculate Conception Seminary," Rev. Msgr. Michael A. Andreano, Vicar General and Chancellor said in an announcement to the archdiocese.

Shortly after his election in March 2013, Pope Francis announced the title monsignor—which means "my lord"—would be reserved for priests serving in

the Vatican diplomatic service, or who rendered distinguished service to the Church and were older than 65. Prior to that, three classes of the title were frequently bestowed by the pope. The chaplain class alone remains under the Holy Father's decree and Msgr. Guarino is the first in the Archdiocese of Newark to receive the honor.

"I am very grateful to Pope Francis and Archbishop Myers for kindly bestowing the title of 'monsignor' on me," Msgr. Guarino said.
"As I said at the ceremony, my theological research and writing has always been generously supported by the archbishop. With this title, Archbishop Myers is honoring the importance of theological research, which is essential to the lifeblood of the Church. He is honoring as well the entire seminary faculty, who work so hard to ensure that our future priests, deacons and lay ministers are fully prepared servants of the Gospel."

A seminary professor since 1982 and full professor since 1995, Msgr. Guarino teaches graduate courses in the Holy Trinity, Revelation and Faith and the MA in theology seminar. His books include *Vincent of Lérins and the Development of Christian Doctrine* and, with Timothy George, *Evangelicals and Catholics Together at Twenty: Vital Statements on Contested Topics.*" He also is a frequent contributor to Theological Studies, The Thomist, and other scholarly journals.

He has been a member of the ecumenical initiative Evangelicals and Catholics Together since 1995

and chairman since 2009.


Son of Peter and Julia Guarino, Msgr. Guarino was raised in Belleville. Msgr. Guarino's sister, Julia Cullen, resides with her husband Joe in Barnegat.

After graduating from Essex Catholic High School, he attended Seton Hall, where he graduated with a bachelor's degree in English literature and classical languages in 1973. He holds licentiate and doctorate degrees in sacred theology from the Catholic University of America. He also holds a bachelor's degree in sacred theology from the pontifical Gregorian University in Rome.

He was ordained a priest in 1977 and served at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church in Newark until then-Archishop Peter L. Gerety released him for doctoral studies.

Msgr. Guarino attributes his vocation to the priesthood to his "strong attraction to the intelligibility, beauty and logic of the Catholic faith. The proportion, harmony and architecture of Catholicism inexorably lead the mind and soul to the presence of God."





Archbishop dedicates new chapel at JPII shrine in Krakow

KRAKOW, POLAND—On May 8, Archbishop John J. Myers was the principal celebrant at the Mass of dedication of a new Chapel of the Americas at the recently opened Saint John Paul II Center here. The center is an evolving complex celebrating the life and teachings of the bishop, pope and saint. It is built upon the site of a quarry where the former Karol Wojtyła was forced to work as a young man during the Nazi occupation of Poland.

The chapel contains a relic of the saint (left), the blood-stained cassock he was wearing on May 13, 1981 when he was shot in Saint Peter's Square, Rome. It also contains numerous mosaics, including an image of both Saint Peter's Basilica and the Cathedral Basilica of the Sacred Heart, symbols of the connection that the people of Newark have with Saint John Paul II, who visited the archdiocese in 1995.

Archbishop Myers was invited to celebrate Mass and dedicate the chapel on the main floor of the



shrine by Cardinal Stanislaus Dziwisz of Krakow, an old friend of the archbishop and Saint John Paul II's former secretary. During the trip to Poland, Archbishop Myers viewed some of the construction underway in Krakow in preparation for next month's World Youth Day, and concelebrated Mass before tens of thousands of people at the annual outdoor celebration of the feast of Saint Stanislaus, bishop and martyr,

the patron saint of the Archdiocese of Krakow and of Poland.

Members of the Polish community of the Archdiocese of Newark—some 150,000 in Bergen, Essex, Hudson and Union Counties—contributed generously toward the construction of the shrine. Close to 40 priests of the archdiocese were born in Poland and Mass is celebrated in Polish in 19 parishes within the archdiocese every week.





Sexton, former president of New York Uuniversity and dean of its Law School, spoke of "sins of omission" in telling the heartening story of his mentor, Charles Francis Winans, Sexton's English teacher at Brooklyn Preparatory High School, an all-boy Jesuit school. Sexton shared his mentor's mantra: "Play another octave on the piano. If there are notes you haven't touched, reach out and touch them."

Murphy, former U.S. Ambassador to Germany and executive at Goldman Sachs, told graduates that what haunted him most was not his failures but his failure to act. "Don't be haunted," he advised the graduates. Quoting Martin Luther King Jr., Murphy said: "The arc of the moral universe is long, but it bends towards justice." He advised graduates to follow the arc.

Felician President Dr. Anne Prisco charged the Class of 2016 to embrace diversity and respect human dignity. "You have learned from experience that once you get to know someone he or she is no longer the other—but rather a fellow student, perhaps even a new friend," she said. 





he answered the call.

Fr. Melillo was at first reluctant to join the priesthood. As a young-ster, he would "babysit the rectory" at Saint Francis Xavier Parish in Newark. "I had an inclination that I wanted to be a priest but I didn't want to follow through. I just wasn't interested." After working at Prudential for three years after graduating high school, he realized "something was not right."

"I went to see my parish priest," Fr. Melillo recalled. "Saint Francis was seven blocks away from my house. By the time I walked from the church to my front door, I knew that I wanted to be a priest. My parents were flabbergasted."

The youngest of seven children, Msgr. Bradley was raised in Jersey City. He was inspired to join the priesthood by his faithful Catholic family and local priests at Saint Paul the Apostle. "The priests in my parish were outstanding," he recalled.

As young men, the three jubilarians were influenced by friendly, devoted priests. They hope to serve as similar examples to the next generation.

"My advice to young priests is to just be the priest that Jesus wants you to be," Fr. Melillo explained.
"Focus on the people, the sacramental life and always be available. You might have to put yourself aside for the needs of others."

Msgr. Kelly offered similar advice. "Listen to the people's needs. Try to provide the best for them and be faithful to that."

Msgr. Bradley believes that offering a powerful and inspiring Mass is crucial. "Being able to celebrate Mass is a real privilege. I minister to retired priests in nursing homes and they all miss saying Mass," he said.

Although the priests in residence at Seton House spent the majority of their ministry at the prep school, they consider themselves parish priests. They all have weekend assignments at local parishes while offering a rich sacramental life at the high school.

"Just because we serve in a school doesn't mean we don't do priestly parish work," Fr. Melillo explained, "We hear confessions, we celebrate Mass, we officiate weddings—Seton Hall Prep is our parish."

Through the years of service within the confines of the high school and beyond, the priests consider themselves "blessed" and "fortunate" to be a part of the priesthood.

"I am so grateful to be a priest," Msgr. Bradley said. "You just try to make each day great. Before you know it, it's been 50 years."

On Archbishop Myers's 50th jubilee

s we celebrated the milestone wedding anniversary masses and numerous ordinations in our cathedral over these past weeks, all gathered somewhat in awe and wonder of how there are still people in today's world who can make and keep such life-long commitments. Be it within the sacraments of matrimony or holy orders, all parties are venturing into the unknown, led by their hearts and their faith in each other and God.



How and why would anyone still want to do it? It takes profound trust, respect, selflessness, commitment, and loyalty among the parties concerned, both human and divine. It is on and from that springboard that the persons making such commitments begin. It is also the daily embracing of all that, and of our one foundation—Jesus Christ—that allows each to continue the journey within the relationship, that must always be purposed towards the mutual love and respect for the other.

Archbishop Myers entered into such a lifelong commitment and relationship on Dec. 17, 1966, when he was ordained a priest of Jesus Christ. It is the first day of the Advent "O Antiphons," which precede the *Magnificat* in Evening Prayer. "O Sapientia"—"O Wisdom, O Holy Word of God, you govern all creation with your strong yet tender care. Come and show your people the way to salvation."

From the perch on which the Lord has hoisted me for almost 13 years, first as personal secretary to the archbishop, and culminating in my current capacity as Vicar General and Chancellor of the Archdiocese of Newark, I have been blessed or cursed (depending upon the day and circumstance) to see things from a very different perspective than most of my brother priests. It seems that everyone: clergy (including myself), religious, and lay, at times think that they have a better answer and approach to things, although not knowing all of the facts. However, none of us ever have the total picture as is the responsibility (and burden) of the archbishop himself. It falls ultimately to him to "show people (including Priests) the way to salvation."

At times, some of us—priests and people—stray from that "way of salvation," be it knowingly, unknowingly, accidentally, purposefully, or grasped by the "ways of the world," which have become more and more different from some of the teachings and traditions of our Catholic faith. The archbishop must attempt to see and understand all and "govern with strong, yet tender care." Sometimes the "tender" can accomplish the task at hand; other times the "strong" is more necessary.

In most cases, the manner in which the archbishop must interact with his priests and people, with whom he is in a relationship of governing, trust, love, and as spiritual father, can never be known to others outside of that one-on-one relationship, given the nature of the encounters and needs of those concerned. In most cases, too, the archbishop is never given the positive credit or acknowledgment for the good that he attempts to bring into all situations (many of which have been accomplished, believe it or not), and into the lives of countless numbers of priests and people throughout these 50 years.

Why would anyone want or continue in such a relationship and responsibility, especially amid untold depths of criticism and second-guessing by others? It has to be only that the person truly believes in the work and relationship within which he is engaged, and truly believes that it will bring benefit—salvation, which is another expression of love —to the other. Pray God, too, that in continuing this mission among God's people, it also brings the other parties in the relationship—further along on their own roads and the ultimate reward of salvation.

Archbishop Myers has been in this work for 50 years. May God reward him for his steadfastness and for his courageous attempts of presenting, explaining and defending (again and again) the teachings of our faith in the midst of a world that, at times, seems not to want to hear anything of God and faith.






