Jersey City parish awarded grant

aint Paul the Apostle Parish, located in the Greenville section of Jersey City, was selected out of hundreds of applicants from parishes across the country to receive a \$3,000 grant from Oregon Catholic Press.

In an August letter sent to Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin, the organization said that it hopes the grant money will "support (Saint Paul's) efforts to enhance their community's liturgy and music." Since its inception in 2001, the annual Oregon Catholic Press Parish Grants program have provided more than \$2.6 million in support of parishes looking to enrich their worship experience.

According to Pastor Father Thomas Thottungal, the church submitted the application in July to help pay for thousands of new missalette book covers. "We are very happy that we received the grant," Fr. Thottungal said.

"We applied for the grant because we need to protect what we have," musical director James Sorrell explained. The missalette covers will ensure that the more than 500 registered parishioners can fully participate in the liturgy.

The grant money will also be used to purchase and install new LED lights for the 130- year-old parish. Although the church used donations to pay for some new light-

ing, the grant will help purchase hundreds of new bulbs.

"It's an old building so it was a bit dim and gloomy. Before the choir and the congregation can sing, you need to be able to see," Sorrell noted.

He believes Saint Paul was awarded the grant because of Oregon Catholic's commitment to improving multicultural ministries and bilingual worship materials.

"We're a bilingual community—we have both English and Spanish liturgies. For the major feast days and holidays, we also have Mass in Tagalog," Sorrell said.

"People in the choirs sing very well and we have a wonderful Spanish language choir," Fr. Thottungal said.

Parishioner Michael Greenwood assisted in the application process. A grant writer for over 30 years, he serves as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion and is a member of the choir.

"We are an inner-city parish that is still growing; we don't have a lot of resources," Greenwood explained. "When we heard about the Oregon Catholic grant, I thought, 'why not give it a shot.' As a grant writer, you are telling a story. I just helped tell the story of Saint Paul Parish."

He referred to the parish as "a light in the darkness" and has seen people who do not usually attend Mass drop in for a service. "I love the homilies—there is always something that makes you stop and think. You always take something away from Mass."

Originally from Tennessee, Greenwood called the multicultural parish "a neat place" with a lot of potential. "I just want to see us improve a little bit. If everyone does a little something, we can see a major difference."

Priest to be honored by Knights of Columbus

NUTLEY—Father John Gordon, coordinator of the archdiocesan Office for Evangelization, will be honored for his service to the Knights of Columbus at an Oct. 7 dinner.

Fr. Gordon has served as chaplain to Council 14712 at Holy Family Parish in Nutley since 2009, when he became a parochial there. He will be presented the Santa Maria Medal as a tribute to "his priestly service, spiritual leadership and fraternal commitment to the Knights," said Steven P. Picciano, Grand Knight.

In addition to the Holy Family Council, Father Gordon serves as chaplain to the Saint Isaac Jogues Assembly of fourth degree knights in Fairfield. Along with the evangelization office, Father Gordon is coordinator of the archdioc-

esan office of multicultural affairs and the charismatic renewal office. He is also dean of Deanery 16.

Ordained to the priesthood in 1988, Fr. Gordon has served as parochial vicar in five parishes; chaplain at Saint Joseph Regional High School in Montvale and director of the pre-theology program at Franciscan University of Steubenville in Ohio. He now resides at Saint Thomas in Bloomfield.

"I'm surprised and I am very honored," Fr. Gordon said of the Knights of Columbus award.

The Santa Maria Medal is the highest honor bestowed by the council. The medal's name honors the Blessed Mother and also refers to the ship piloted by Christopher Columbus on his voyage to the New World.

Thousands celebrate Cardinal Tobin's pallium

ardinal Joseph W. Tobin, C.Ss.R. received the pallium signifying his close ties with his flock and the Holy Father from the U.S. papal nuncio at a Sept. 14 Mass at the Cathedral Basilica of the Sacred Heart in Newark.

More than 2,000 clergy, consecrated religious and laity—including Cardinal Tobin's "noisy yet charming clan"—applauded after Archbishop Christophe Pierre arranged the circlet of lamb's wool on the "shoulders that are quite wide" of the sixth archbishop of Newark.

"I confess that, among all the 'stuff' episcopal ministry requires that I wear, the item I appreciate most is what I received today," Cardinal Tobin said. "Made of pure lamb's wool and draped over the shoulders, the symbolism of the pallium is even more concrete: the lamb's wool is meant to represent the lost, sick or weak sheep, which the shepherd places on his shoulders and carries to the waters of life."

It was imposed 10 months into a tenure already marked by outreach and inclusiveness with advocacy for immigrants, the gay community and dozens of visits to deaneries, parishes, schools and archdiocesan institutions.

Although Newark's other archbishops received the pallium, the ceremonies were in Rome, a practice Pope Francis changed in 2015 when he asked that they be held in home dioceses. This was the first such liturgy in the cathedral since Oct. 19, 1954, when second Newark Archbishop Thomas A. Boland received his pallium on the day the cathedral officially opened after a half-century of construction.

Cardinal Tobin's pallium Mass was held on the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, the instrument of salvation singled out in his coat of the arms, as adapted from that of the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer - the Redemptorist community to which he belongs.

The array of red vestments worn by the prelates in the sanctuary were complemented by the colors an afternoon sun poured into one of the nation's largest gothic cathedrals through its 214 stained glass

windows and as its soaring vaults reverberated with hymns led by the cathedral choir, a brass ensemble and the organ's 9,513 pipes.

School children were among the 2,000 worshipers.

"It's exciting to see," said Eddie Stoker, a fifth grader, who came from Park Ridge with his sister Mary and their parents Ed and Maureen.

"It's a big honor for him and for us," added Mary, a seventh grader at Our Lady of Mercy Academy.

Maria Alvarado, religion coordinator at Holy Spirit School in Union, came to Newark with three students and principal Armand Lamberti, who called it a teachable moment. "This is a historical moment and important in the life of the church," Alvarado said.

For eight grader Isabella Pastore, the first time in the Cathedral Basilica was an awesome experience. "It's so beautiful," she said.

Hierarchy in the sanctuary included 20 bishops and archbishops, Cardinal Justin F. Rigali, Archbishop Emeritus of Philadelphia and Archbishop John J. Myers. Cardinal Tobin succeeded him last November, after Archbishop Myers reached the mandatory retirement age of 75.

Originally, Archbishop Bernard A. Hebda, formerly of Gaylord,

Mich., was to have succeeded Archbishop Myers but, after serving 18 months as coadjutor bishop, Pope Francis named him archbishop of Saint Paul-Minneapolis in March 2016.

In November, the pope named Cardinal Tobin, then the archbishop of Indianapolis, as Newark's sixth archbishop. The appointment came barely a month after the pope named him a cardinal but before he received his red biretta. He is New Jersey's first-ever cardinal.

Born in Detroit and ordained a priest in 1978, he has served overseas as a Redemptorist priest and Vatican official and is fluent in Spanish, Italian, Portuguese and French, skills helpful in leading the 1.2 million Catholics of many cultures who live in Bergen, Essex Hudson and Union counties.

The pallium dates to the fourth century and was worn only by popes until they began conferring it upon metropolitan archbishops – those who preside over an ecclesiastical province. The Province of New Jersey consists of the Archdiocese of Newark and the Dioceses of Trenton, Camden, Paterson and Metuchen, whose bishops concelebrated last Thursday.

Two bands hanging at the front and back of the pallium are embroi-

dered with six black crosses that recall the wounds of the crucified Christ; three large jeweled pins symbolize the nails of the cross of Jesus.

"He offered himself freely and fully as an acceptable sacrifice upon the cross," Archbishop Pierre said in his homily. "This is what it means to be a Good Shepherd: to give life, to offer one's life in sacrifice for everyone; for you, for me, for every man and woman."

"In accepting this pallium I intend to spend my life for the flock, imitating the Good Shepherd who bears all of us on his shoulders," Cardinal Tobin said at the conclusion of the Mass. "I am aware that Peter once promised something similar to Jesus, and then ran away, so I ask that you pray for me."

Cardinal Tobin was one of 36 archbishops invited to concelebrate Mass with Pope Francis in Saint Peter's Square June 29, the feast of Saints Peter and Paul. After the Mass, Pope Francis handed each archbishop his pallium.

Earlier, he urged the archbishops not to be "armchair" Christians, but to be "apostles on the go" who confess Jesus with their lives.




Pallium Mass

Remarks by Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin, C.Ss.R., at the Mass of the Imposition of the Pallium

our Excellency, Archbishop Christophe Pierre, Cardinal Justin Rigali, brother bishops of the Ecclesiastical Province of Newark and beyond, beloved priests, deacons, religious and faithful of this great archdiocese, dear friends,

Before I ask God's blessing and we conclude this lovely celebration, I would like to offer a few words on the meaning of the vestment I received today from the hands of the Apostolic Nuncio to the United States. Pope John XXIII once called cardinals and bishops the *appendiabiti* or "coat hangers" of the church, pegs of all shapes and sizes on which the church drapes her tradition. It is always nice to be useful.

I confess that, among all the "stuff" episcopal ministry requires that I wear, the item I appreciate most is what I received today. The pallium appeared in our church as early as the fourth century. Originally worn by the bishop of Rome, its use eventually extended to metropolitan archbishops. It represents the close union between an archbishop and the Holy Father. Made of pure lamb's wool and draped over the shoulders, the symbolism of the pallium is even more concrete: the lamb's wool is meant to represent the lost, sick or weak sheep, which the shepherd places on his shoulders and carries to the waters of life.

Therefore, the bishop should look for the lost and make every effort to bring them home. When he blessed this pallium last June 29th, Pope Francis told the archbishops present with him in St. Peter's Square what that mission should cost. He asked the archbishops whether we were in fact "armchair" Christians, who love to chat about how things are going in the church and the world, or apostles on the go, who confess Jesus with their lives because they hold him in their hearts. Pope Francis explained the difference. Those who confess Jesus know that they are not simply to offer opinions but to offer their very lives. After all, good and bad shepherds look the same on a pleasant day like today. It is only when the wolf nears, or the journey passes through the valley of darkness, that one can identify the good shepherd. He is the one who does not run away. He is ready to lay down his life for those entrusted to him.


Early last spring, the bishops of Camden, Trenton, Patterson, Metuchen and I fixed this date, the Feast of the Holy Cross, for the imposition of the pallium. Several months later, on the day he blessed this pallium, Pope Francis unconsciously affirmed the appropriateness of that choice. He said, "Apart from the cross, there is no Christ, but apart from the cross, there can be no Christian

either." What is more, accepting the pallium and the mission it represents means "accepting the cross, pressing on in the confident knowledge that we are not alone: the crucified and risen Lord is at our side. So, with Paul, we can say that "we are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken" (2 Cor 4:8-9).

Brothers and sisters of the five diocesan churches that form the Province of New Jersey, in accepting this pallium I intend to spend my life for the flock, imitating the Good Shepherd who bears all of us on his shoulders. I am aware that Peter once promised something similar to Jesus, and then ran away, so I ask that you pray for me. I am grateful for all the signs of God's providence present here today: my brother bishops, the presbyterate of the Archdiocese of Newark, consecrated women and men, especially my Redemptorist confireres, the dedicated colleagues of the chancery, lay leaders, and beloved friends.

From my heart, I thank my mother, siblings, nieces, nephews and all the members of our noisy yet charming clan: your presence is a vivid reminder to me of the incredible generosity of your love. Because of the hope we have in Jesus, I believe that my Dad, grandparents, aunts and uncles, departed teachers and friends are united with us in the communion of saints. To all of you, I repeat the grateful words of St. Paul, "I give thanks to my God at every remembrance of you, praying always with joy in my every prayer for all of you, because of your partnership for the gospel from the first day until now (Phil. 1, 3-5).

May the Good Shepherd, who longs to see his flock gathered together, continue to lead us in peace and joy. May the Mother of God, given as a mother ready at every moment to help us, guide us to a deeper love for her Son, the redeemer of the world!

Among the liturgical insignia of the Supreme Pontiff, one of the most evocative is the pallium made of white wool, symbol of the bishop as the good shepherd and, at the same time, of the Lamb Crucified for the salvation of the human race. Men's post-abortion healing retreat Oct. 7

NEWARK—Lumina and the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal will host "Entering Canaan: Men's Day of Prayer and Healing from Abortion" Oct. 7 at the Archdiocesan Center. The retreat offers a hope-filled message of God's mercy, healing and forgiveness for men who have a lost a child to abortion.

Theresa Bonopartis, program director at Lumina, developed the men's retreat 15 years ago.

"We were conducting post-abortion healing retreats with men and women and I felt that the men were not being completely honest with their experience. They would often feel protective of the women or try to comfort them," she explained. Bonopartis noticed a huge difference when the men had their own space to heal.

"Usually at the healing retreats, the women are distraught and are sharing their painful ex-

periences with abortion. The men needed their own place to talk to each other and facilitate their own healing," she said.

Men share their varying experiences.

"Some of the men on the retreat once pressured women to have an abortion," Bonopartis said. "We have men who are currently married to women who've had abortions and are having difficulty in their relationship."

The retreat is usually held twice a year. The program is also offered in other cities, including Saint Louis and Washington, D.C. Father Mariusz Koch, C.F.R., will lead the retreat, where there will be group discussion, adoration, opportunities for confession and a closing Mass.






