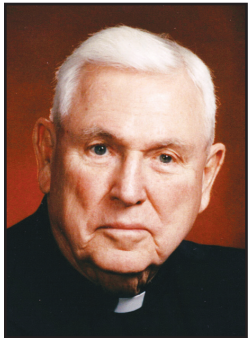


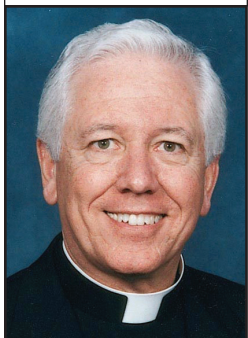

Archbishop cites work of 'well-deserving' leaders

Pope Benedict XVI honors 28 in archdiocese

His Holiness Pope Benedict XVI has bestowed the honorary title of Reverend Monsignor upon 18 priests of the Archdiocese of Newark, and further elevated two monsignors of the archdiocese. Eight Religious priests, Brothers and Sisters also were honored by the pontiff with the Benemerenti Medal for Religious men and women.

The rank of "Monsignor" honors a priest with one of three different titles: Chaplain to His Holiness, Prelate of Honor, and Protonotary Apostolic Supernumerary. Among the 20 priests honored, one is named Protonotary Apostolic Supernumerary, four are named Prelate of Honor, and 15 are named Chaplain to His Holiness.

Elevated in rank from his previous honor as Prelate of Honor to that of Protonotary Apostolic Supernumerary is Reverend Monsignor Ronald J. Rozniak, pastor, Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish, Ridgewood, and vicar general for "missio sui juris"—Turks & Caicos Islands.

Elevated in rank from his previous honor as Chaplain to His Holiness to that of Prelate of Honor is Reverend Monsignor William J. Fadrowski, pastor, Queen of Peace Parish, North Arlington.

Honored as Prelates of Honor to His Holiness with the title of Reverend Monsignor are:

The Catholic Church itself is two millennia young and just as strong as it was when Jesus walked the streets of Jerusalem and taught the Truth to the earliest

followers of the Faith.

There is very little, my brother priests and dear Religious Sisters and Brothers, that we can do to demonstrate the love and respect that you deserve as we commemorate the day each of you said "Yes" to the call to serve Jesus Christ, His Church and her people, except to ask Our Lord to continue to bless you, as He has blessed us with your presence among us.

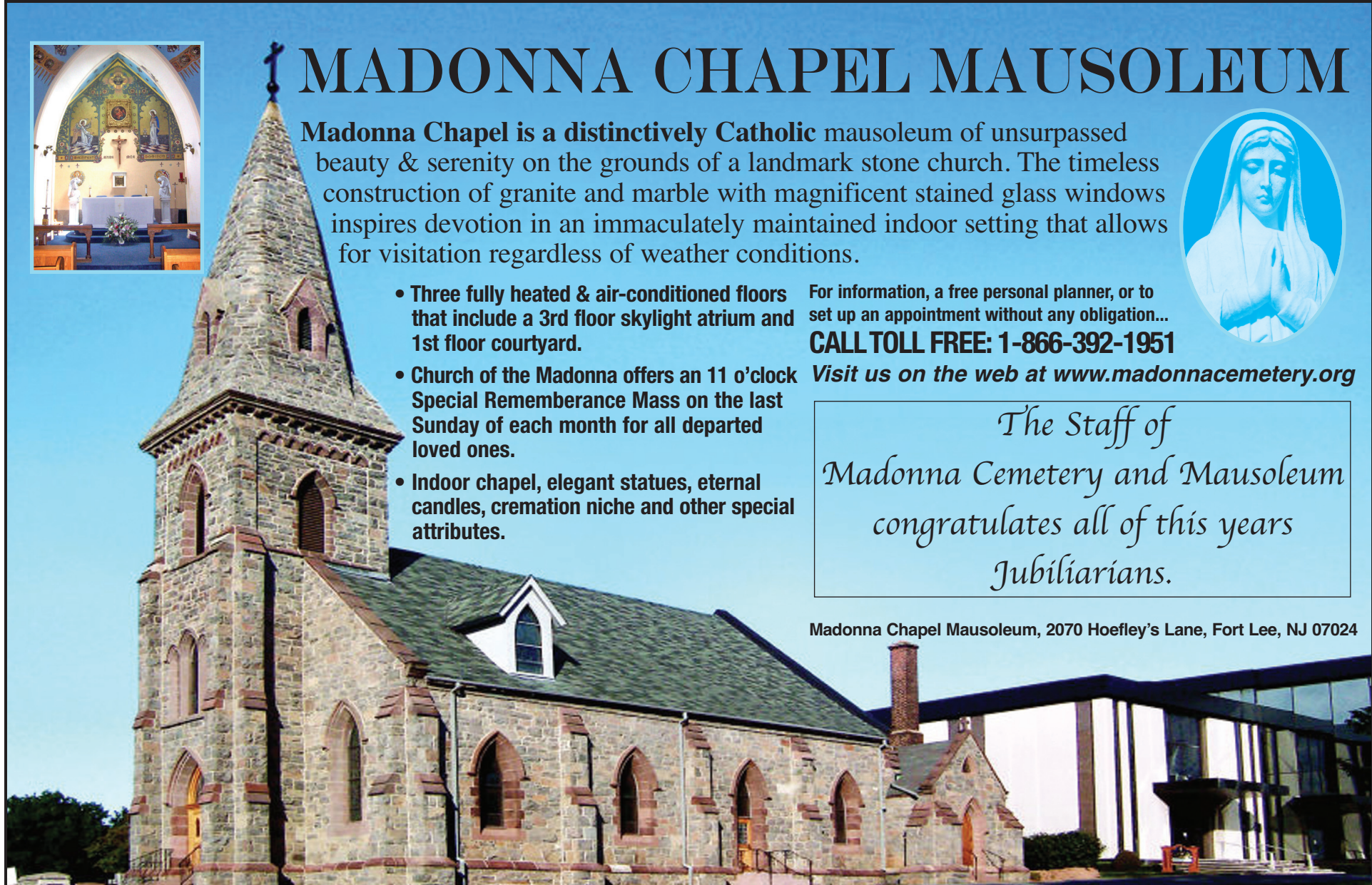



The celebration of Holy Week involves so many aspects of our faith that we cannot absorb their manifold dimensions. Holy Thursday is not a holy day of obligation, so perhaps some of the faithful do not have the opportunity to express gratitude for Christ's self-giving in the Eucharist. Although every Sunday provides such an occasion, the Church in 1264 instituted a special feast to solemnize our appreciation for Christ's eucharistic gift.

In every age, the Bishops and their associates "should constantly exert themselves to have the faithful know and live the Paschal Mystery more deeply through the Eucharist and thus become a firmly knit body in the solidarity of Christ's love" (Vatican II, Decree on Bishops No. 15).

For centuries theologians and philosophers have discussed and debated the wonderful doctrine of Catholic faith that Christ is truly present under the eucharistic species of bread and wine. These efforts to understand and to answer objections to this teaching are very important. However, only by focusing on the Paschal Mystery of Jesus' death and resurrection can we begin to realize the full implications of the surprising gift that Jesus offered at the Last Supper.

Saint Mark emphasized that this was the feast of Passover, when lambs were sacrificed in the Temple and unleavened bread was eaten at all meals.

When Jesus took the bread and said the blessing (an act of thanks and praise), the disciples expected the Master to offer pieces of the one loaf to them. The words should have been an Aramaic formula: "This is the bread of affliction, which our ancestors ate in the land of Egypt." What a surprise were Jesus' words: "This is my body!"

Yet after the resurrection, they came to grasp that Jesus had accomplished a new Passover, liberating people from slavery, not merely to oppressive men but to sin and Satan. They knew that each generation experienced the redemptive power of God through these symbols of bread and the lamb. They realized that Jesus had come not only to bring gifts, but to offer Himself as sacrifice and gift to humankind.

The full implications of His words struck home as they recalled His command: "Do this in memory of me!" The Hebrews had learned long before that the memorial represented the inner

reality of God's gifts.

The abundant wine in the Passover Meal symbolized the fullness of joy in Kingdom of God to which Jesus alluded. The "fruit of the vine" also was known as "the blood of grapes" (Gn 49:11). Jesus again surprised His disciples: "This is my blood, the blood of the covenant, to be poured out on behalf of the many."

The Passover was linked intimately with the Covenant at Mount Sinai, so the disciples would have recalled the sacrifice of Moses to seal the covenantal bond between God and Israel. Now His

people were a nation with the promise of a land of its own. In that land, the Israelites would be free to serve God alone. So after the people promise to obey, Moses sprinkled blood on them: "This is the blood of the Covenant" (Ex 24:8).

Jesus intended His death to be a sign of His witness to the obedience that all creatures owe to their Creator. But an act of reconciliation for sin was required to render people worthy of this vocation. The death of Jesus took place for the deliverance from transgressions committed under the first Covenant (Hebrews

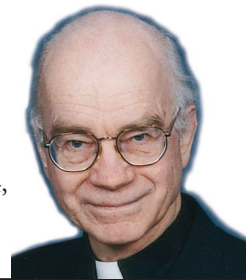
9:15) and at all other times.

As eternal high priest, He continues to offer this worship, to which we have the privilege of uniting our own praise. Then, as we receive Christ, we grow as His Body and as the living Temple of God, united with each other in the solidarity of his love.

Msgr. Sheeran to leave SHU post in 2010

SOUTH ORANGE—Msgr. Robert Sheeran, after serving 15 years at the helm of Seton Hall University (SHU)—the nation's oldest diocesan university—will step down from the presidency in June 2010.

In making the announcement June 3 at the university's board of regents meeting, Msgr. Sheeran

explained this was a "deeply personal and spiritual decision."

The SHU board of regents will establish a search committee during the summer months, hoping to name Sheeran's successor in time for the new president to take the reins in July 2010.

"With Msgr. Robert Sheeran's recent announcement, I want to express my deep gratitude for his accomplishments at Seton Hall University," Archbishop John J. Myers said. "We have witnessed many contributions to the centrality of the Catholic mission of Seton Hall University. Renovation of the university's historic chapel, institution of the DOVE student volunteer program, and enlivening and strengthening of the campus ministry are only a few examples of these accomplishments.

"At the time of the (Boland Hall) fire in 2000, Msgr. Sheeran led the university community—students, parents, faculty and friends—through one of its darkest moments with grace, compassion and determination," Archbishop Myers continued. The deadly

blaze, which swept through Boland Hall Jan. 19, 2000, claimed three lives and left many others severely injured. Msgr. Sheeran lived in the residence where the fire occurred, along with the students, that semester.

"Beyond these particular examples, Msgr. Sheeran has been an integral part of the life of Seton Hall, first as a distinguished graduate, and then for some 30 years as a leader and motivator in roles as varied as rector of the college seminary, Saint Andrew's Hall, associate provost, executive vice chancellor and, finally, president," Archbishop Myers said.

"As the regents begin the process of selecting a new president of the university of this great archdiocese, I am sure that they will be thinking much about Msgr. Sheeran's impact on Seton Hall. I offer the regents my prayers and will support them as they look to find a priest who will be a worthy successor who can build on the solid foundation of faith and academic superiority that Seton Hall is today," he said.

"Msgr. Sheeran's leadership has been remarkable. It is hard to imagine the university without his sure hand and exceptional vision for higher education in the 21st century," Kurt T. Borowsky, chairman of SHU's board of regents, said.

The tenure of Msgr. Sheeran, 63, at SHU is marked by wide-ranging changes in university life, including a five-fold increase in the university's endowment, one of the strongest financial positions it has enjoyed in its 153-year history.

The university's capital campaign in 2007, which raised \$153 million, funded a series of initiatives at SHU, including an extensive restoration of the campus's historic chapel, which was built in 1863 (see *The Catholic Advocate*, Nov. 12, 2008).

Another highlight during his tenure is the Whitehead School of Diplomacy and International Relations' World Leaders Forum, which was established in 1997.

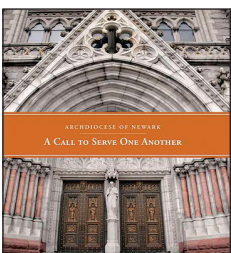

Recalling three servants of God

*"Praise the Holy Trinity:
Shea, O'Brien, Finnerty;
Holy God, Mighty God, God
Immortal, be adored!"*

If you attended Mass on the weekend of June 6 and 7 you very likely would have sung most of the words of the above refrain, minus the proper surnames. On the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, always the first Sunday after Pentecost, we pay special attention to the "Undivided Unity" of three Divine Persons in one God: The Father, The Son, and The Holy Spirit. This belief is based on revelations from God as recorded in various ways throughout the Bible's Old and New Testaments.

The most-learned saints acknowledged that it is a mystery

neither fully understandable nor adequately explainable. Nonetheless, it is the core belief of our faith, which trusts the God, who has revealed His Love

authority, which these three servants of God exercised over the seminary community.

Prior to my arrival, Fr. Jim had been reassigned to a parish and replaced in his position by Fr. (later Msgr.) Joseph F. Flusk. Although this was the beginning of some dramatic post-Vatican II reorienta-

tion of seminary formation, it still retained enough of the old ways for us to appreciate what was while we started to experience what more there could be. Of course, the parodied hymn began to sink into obscurity, given the lack of a surname that rhymed with "Trinity."

Many priests have served and continue to serve as effective administrators in our now three archdiocesan seminaries. Many of the old-timers have gone to God; Msgr. Finnerty has ably served in several pastorates, as vicar for priests, and until recent-

ly as the representative for the retired priests on our Presbyteral Council.

As our recent *Catholic Advocate* coverage demonstrated, we are blessed with a solid number of seminarians who will be the priests of tomorrow. Pray for them, their instructors, directors, and administrators, and all the priests who continue to serve with dedication and commitment.
