DEACONS ORDAINED-In a solemn yet joyous celebration before fellow clergy, family and friends the weekend of May 21-22, the Archdiocese of Newark welcomed 35 new permanent deacons (top photo) and 16 transitional deacons into service. Most Rev. Thomas A. Donato, Auxiliary Bishop of Newark, celebrated both liturgies at the Cathedral Basilica of the Sacred Heart in Newark. The permanent deacons were ordained on Saturday and the transitional deacons on Sunday. As has been the case with priestly ordinations over the years, the archdiocese is among the national leaders with the number of permanent deacons being ordained. The Class of 2011 is the first since the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops launched an effort six years ago to revamp the program with an emphasis on uniformity. A total of 16 men were ordained transitional deacons. They will become priests a year from now. At the end of each Mass the newly ordained accompanied by Bishop Donato gathered on the altar to the thunderous applause of those who filled the Cathedral Basilica.

A praise concert will take place Friday, July 1, at 7:30 p.m. Workshops and speaker presentations are slated for Saturday, July 2, followed by a healing service at 8 p.m. On Sunday, July 3, a High Mass will celebrated.

# Rome choir's joyful voices to resound at Cathedral

NEWARK—The Choir of the Diocese of Rome will perform at the Cathedral Basilica of the Sacred Heart, 89 Ridge St., on Friday, June 10 at 7:30 p.m.

The Livingston Symphony Orchestra will accompany the choir with a repertoire featuring original pieces specifically composed for the late Pope John Paul II. The choir performed at the late pontiff's beatification May 1 at the Vatican.

Theologian and director, Rev. Msgr. Marco Frisina, founded the Choir of the Diocese of Rome in 1984. The group was created to accompany major diocesan liturgies, many of which are presided over by the Holy Father. Although the choir has 250 members, only about 50 made the trip for the American tour.

An accomplished composer, Msgr. Frisina has created 20 sacred oratorios, composed operas ("The Divine Comedy" and "The Miracle of Marcellino") and has more than 150 liturgical hymns published in 25 collections. He has won several awards for authoring soundtracks for religious and historical films. Msgr. Frisina has also collaborated with noteworthy musicians such as Paddy Maloney of the Chieftains and Italian superstars Mina and Andrea Bocelli.

"Being the choir for our diocese is special because our bishop happens to be the pope," Msgr. Frisina explained. "We have a strong connection with the Holy Father and our commitment to him is exceptional." The director recalls with vivid memory performing in front of 300,000 people at the Vigil for Pope John Paul II's beatification at the Circo Massimo in Rome. Choir members were on their feet for three hours during the entire service.

"The Rite of Beatification is very simple but very beautiful," he continued. "The choir performed at the moment the tapestry of the late pope was unveiled. It was a very important moment for us and for the Church. Most of the choir members were crying as they were singing."

The anthem "Hymn to the Blessed Pope John Paul II: Open the Doors to Christ" was specifically composed by Msgr. Frisina for the occasion. "The late pope was like a father to me; like family. In the song, I tried to synthesize the words and gestures of Pope John Paul II. I tried to combine his sweetness and strength, along with his enthusiasm, into the piece." The Cathedral Basilica of the Sacred Heart is just one of the stops on the six-date tour. The choir has two repertoires; one of secular music for auditoriums and one of scared music for religious spaces. "Each performance begins with a prayer to the Holy Spirit for the grace not only to listen with our ears, but our hearts," Msgr. Frisina added.

The composer believes music is universal and a powerful tool for expressing faith. "Music is a gift from God to communicate great human and divine things. Words





can express things but music has the power to say even greater things. Music is an expression of the spiritual dimension of man; it is a dialogue with God. It has the ability to penetrate the heart of man and is an act of love. The world needs more true music: not used for commercial entertainment, but to express the link between humanity and faith."

Msgr. Frisina attended the Conservatory of Santa Cecilia in Rome where he received a degree in composition before entering the Pontifical Roman Major Seminary to study theology. He was ordained in 1982 and since 1991 has served as director of the Liturgical Office of the Vicariate of Rome and master of the Pontifical Lateran Choir.

"I knew I wanted to be a priest while studying music," he said. "The two vocations are linked. Since I was a child, I loved music. I would listen to our record player all day long. One day my parents became so desperate that they unplugged the machine. Music was my natural form of expression. When I was 22 years old, I decided to join the priesthood. With the priesthood, I have the freedom to sing the love of God. Music opens the door to God."

Through composing and directing music, Msgr. Frisina shares a connection with the faithful audience. "Through music, I can stay in the hearts of people. When I am performing, I feel that the audiences are my friends and family. I write for them and with them. When the choir performs, it is not like a traditional concert—it is an experience together. When we sing in a cathedral, we sing with God and to God."

When he founded the choir, Msgr. Frisina wanted to join together the young people of Rome in musical community. After more than 20 years, the group has doubled and size with members from various ages and backgrounds, united together in song. They volunteer their time and talent to perform. "We pieced together young people from all the Roman parishes. I only had about 100 people in the choir and every year, there are more changes. The chorus offers their time and we ask for many sacrifices."

All choir members paid their own way and used their personal time off from work to participate in the North American tour. "The singers that we have are not professional, but the way they sing and the sacrifices they make to sing are important," Msgr. Frisina said.

## Like the Marines, jubilarians remain faithful, ready to serve

few weeks ago the jovial bishop of Trenton, John "Mort" Smith, celebrated his 50th anniversary of ordination. When Bishop Smith had been in Trenton a few years he jokingly uttered the phrase, 'Thank God for Newark.'

It was not so much because of his deep love for our archdiocese that he spoke those words, although he was born, bred and nurtured in these parts, but more because, in Trenton, as in many dioceses, there is an acute shortage of priests.

Bishop Smith had a problem. He had to supply for the spiritual needs of his parishes. The diocese was inundated with hundreds of thousands of people at the Jersey Shore in the summertime, but more instant was the need to serve the countless number of Catholics who have migrated to Monmouth and Ocean counties.

So, fortunately for our good friend and wonderful priest, a great number of retired priests from the Newark Archdiocese also have headed south to warmer pastures in retirement. A priest is a priest "forever" and these good men are there ready and willing to carry on their ministry. They may be freed from administrative tasks, but their zeal for God and his people still burns strong. They are like the Marines, "Semper

Fidelis, "—"always faithful," and like the Coast Guard *"Semper Paratus,"*—"always ready" to serve wherever and whenever needed.

The great theologian Karl Rahner described growing old in the priesthood as a man walking on a journey. As he begins he is surrounded by young, exuberant, handsome young men. Then as the journey continues through the years, one by one they drop off and disappear into the shadows at the side of the road. The years pass and soon you are nearly alone among your peer group while the memories of the bright faces of yesteryear haunt your mind.

Yet the reality is this: these retired priests are the same young men as they were at ordination. They are just a little slower in step because of a body that shows its age; a little more hardened from the years in the apostolate; a lot wiser from countless encounters with people; and hopefully molded into a far deeper spirituality than they were in those first days as a priest.

We lived in our formative years in a seminary in what Msgr. Robert Wister called in his marvelous history of our seminary, "Stewards of the Mysteries of God," an ascetic life in a manorial setting. Three hundred





most a monastic setting. We studied, played, prayed and ate together. We wore the same clerical clothes. We laughed, argued and "kibitzed" together. We knew every other seminarian and they knew us. Every one was different even though from the outside we may have appeared homogenized. Those years were not easy. But they produced some of the most marvelous holy priests on God's earth.

Individually each man had his special gifts and talents. Some were scholarly. Some were great administrators. Some were wonderful confessors, spiritual guides, counselors or psychologists. But above all, they were pastoral. They fed the flock of God with word and sacrament. They labored in the vineyard of the Lord-some in rocky little corners of that vineyard. They bore the burden of the day's heat in the service of the Lord Jesus.

And so, for all the priests, Sisters and Brothers celebrating a special anniversary, who are featured in this edition of The Catholic Advocate, we salute them. They have truly lived up to the ideal "Stewards of the Mysteries of God." And we can thank God in harmony with Bishop Smith. Thank God for the retired priests of Newark who gave themselves to God and his people. These dedicated men are still in the process of offering their lives to the Lord. Praise the Lord!

We end with the priestly fraternal wish for them all: "Ad multos annos"—"to many years." May the Lord continue to bless them all with long life so that they may bless us by their presence. And, by the way, special congratulations to Bishop Smith, who having retired, now joins the ranks in that band of brothers who still stand ready to serve this community, this Mystical Body, this Church.

# St. Lucy to display Pompeii icon during June 16-18 masses

NEWARK-Saint Lucy Parish, 118 Seventh Ave., will host the Pompeii Marian Mission in the United States from Thursday June 16 to Saturday, June 18, which will display of the "missionary image icon," a 60-by-49-inch painting.

Masses on June 16 and 17 at 6:30 p.m. and a noon Mass on June 18 will celebrate the arrival of the Marian Mission. The holy icon is an image-a faithful copy of the original painting that depicts the Blessed Mother and Child, surrounded by stars. The original painting is maintained in the Italian city of Pompeii, famously associated with the eruption of Mount Vesuvius in the year 79. Following its display at Saint Lucy, the icon will be transported to Saint Rocco Parish, Glen Cove, Long Island, New York.

Rev. Msgr. Joseph F. Ambrioso, V.F., the pastor of Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish and the archdiocesan Italian Apostolate Coordinator, said Saint Lucy was selected as the site to house the holy icon because the parish most closely resembles the Basilica of the Rosary in Pompeii. Father Luigi Zanotto, M.C.C.J., is the pastor of Saint Lucy. Call the parish at (973) 803-4200 for more information on the Marian Mission.

Father Matthew R. Mauriello, the pastor of Saint Roch Parish, Greenwich, CT, is the coordinator of the U.S. mission. Born in Newark

in 1956, Fr. Mauriello was raised in East Orange and attended Saint Joseph Parish. He is a 1977 graduate of Seton Hall Prep, West Orange. In 1988 he was ordained in Puerto Rico and later began his ministry in the Diocese of Bridgeport, CT.

"I had the opportunity to visit the Basilica in Pompeii and had the opportunity to meet the wonderful priests and maintain contact with them," Fr. Mauriello recalled in an e-mail note. "Our dear Lord gave me a beautiful surprise when I received a call from them asking me to help in the organization of their Marian Mission."

In November 2010, a delegation from the Pontifical Basilica of Our Lady of Pompeii in Italy arrived in the United States enlisted Fr. Mauriello's support. and devotion to her. Most Rev. Carlo Liberato, the

Prelate of Pompeii, will be a principal part of the mission. The missionary image, which is an exact replica of the original, will visit cathedrals and parishes in the northeastern part of the United States.

The significance of the Marian Mission to the United States is to help us to redirect our gaze toward our Heavenly Mother and her Son, Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ," Fr. Mauriello explained.

He shared the story of Blessed Bartolo Longo, who was beatified by Blessed Pope John Paul II, on Oct. 26, 1980. The pope had called him the "Apostle of the Rosary" and wrote that his beatification is a triumph of God's mercy and the power of the rosary to instruct the hearts of all in the message of the Gospel of Jesus.

After his conversion, Blessed Bartolo Longo began to restore a dilapidated church in October 1873 and sponsored an annual festival in honor of Our Lady of the Rosary. In 1875, he had obtained a Continued on page 26

worn painting of Our Lady of the Rosary from a convent in Naples and raised the funds to get the image restored so as to locate it in the church.

The only way to transport the image to Pompeii was on a cart filled with manure—a humble way for the Queen of Heaven to arrive. Soon, miracles of healing began and people flocked to the church. The bishop of Nola encouraged Bartolo Longo to construct a larger church, which was consecrated in 1891. It was enlarged in 1939, and is known today as the Basilica of Our Lady of the Most Holy Rosary of Pompeii. Blessed Bartolo Longo also saved the lives of many poor children by opening schools.

Fr. Mauriello expressed his hope that many people in the Archdiocese of Newark will visit the pilgrim image. An early church, located on Evergreen Street, was named Saint Mary, Star of the Sea and on Sept. 9, 1860, the first Mass was celebrated. The current Gothic church of Saint Mary, Star of the Sea, located at 326 Ave. C, was blessed and dedicated in November 1881.






#### Fr. William Giblin; headmaster at **Seton Hall Prep School**


A Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated May 18 at Holy Rosary Parish, Edgewater, for Father William M. Giblin, 79, who died May 13.

Fr. Giblin was ordained in 1959. He served as parochial vicar of Queen of Peace Parish, North Arlington, from 1959 to 1960, and at Saint Mary Parish, Rutherford, from 1960 to 1961.

Assigned to Seton Hall Preparatory School, West Orange, in 1961, Fr. Giblin taught religion and history, was athletic director and became headmaster from 1969 to 1980. He continued to serve at Seton Hall Prep until 1988.


#### Sr. Mercedes Salinas, S.C.


