Class of 2013 begins priesthood journey

LEST WE FORGET THEIR SACRIFICE—The Catholic Cemeteries Office of the Archdiocese of Newark once again hosted outdoor Memorial Day masses at archdiocesan cemeteries, but this year the local observance was part of a campaign of 1,000 Catholic cemeteries throughout the United States. Archbishop John J. Myers presided at the Mass celebrated at Holy Cross Cemetery, North Arlington, while newly ordained Father Carmine Rizzi of Nutley delivered the homily. Following Mass, there was a wreath-laying ceremony at a monument in the cemetery dedicated to the men and women who have served in the U.S. Armed Forces. The monument inscription reads "America will always be grateful to these honorable individuals for keeping our country free." Parish cemeteries in the Archdiocese of Newark also celebrated outdoor masses on Memorial Day. Andrew P. Schafer is the executive director of the archdiocesan Catholic Cemeteries Office and the vice president of the Catholic Cemetery Conference, based in Hillside, IL. (See pages 13 for more photos.)

A dozen men were ordained, 11 for the service of the Church of Newark and one for the service to the Church in the Order of Augustinian Recollects. Ordained were Emmanuel Otuosoruchi Agu; Eugenio Palileo de la Rama; Elvio Esteban Batista; SungGye Hong; Jeong Gyeong Kim; Doroteo Layosa II; Archibald Lindo Mabini; Nelson Yobani Oyola Garcia; Pedro Repollet; Duberley Salazar; Jose Robinson Valencia Valencia and for the Augustinian Recollects Jorge Mateos-Perez. Citing the fact the ordinandi had responded to the Lord’s call, Archbishop Myers declared it’s “a wonderful thing to know your vocation.” Those who were ordained, the archbishop noted, will be “a sounding board of God’s Word.” Being ordained as a transitional deacon is one of the final steps in the process of becoming a priest. The word “deacon” comes from the Greek word “diakonia,” which means “service.”

This year the SFIC will give \$2.5 million in tuition assistance to 2,200 students in grades K-12. Over the years the SFIC has supported more than 40,000 students with over \$30 million in tuition assistance.

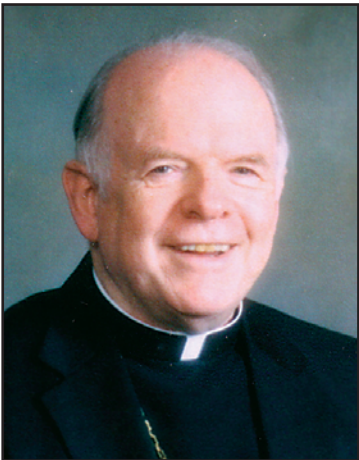

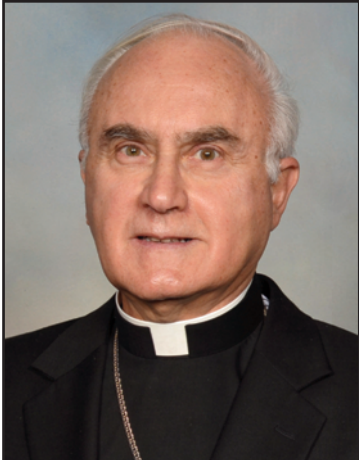

NEWARK—The Archdiocese of Newark will participate in the second annual “Fortnight for Freedom,” a nationwide celebration slated for June 21 to July 4, which involves efforts by the Catholic Church to educate Americans on challenges to religious liberty both at home and abroad.

Archbishop John J. Myers, in a recent letter to archdiocesan priests, wrote that he’s “hoping and praying that a more earnest reflection by those entrusted with the care of the common good, will lead them to embrace the broader view of religious liberty and respect for the individual conscience that is both the tradition and the hallmark of the American commitment to ordered liberty.”

The auxiliary bishops of the Archdiocese of Newark, representing the four counties that they serve, will kick off the fortnight with Holy Hour devotional services. For Bergen County, Bishop John W. Flesey, S.T.D., will preside on Wednesday, June 26, 7 p.m., at Most Blessed Sacrament Parish, 787 Franklin Lake Rd., Franklin Lakes. For Essex County, Bishop Edgar M. da Cunha, S.D.V., will preside on Tuesday, June 25, 7:30 p.m. at Saint Philomena Parish, 386 South Livingston Ave., Livingston. For Hudson County, Bishop Thomas A. Donato will preside on Monday, June 24, 7 p.m., at Saint Henry Parish, 82 West 29th St., Bayonne. For Union County, Bishop Manuel A. Cruz will preside on Sunday, June 30, noon, at Saint Bartholomew Parish, 2032 Westfield Ave., Scotch Plains.

Last year the Ad Hoc Committee on Religious Liberty for the Washington DC-based U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops

(USCCB) issued a call for the first fortnight. As with last year’s fortnight, the national observance will begin and end with special masses. Archbishop William E. Lori of Baltimore, chairman of the USCCB’s Ad Hoc Committee for Religious Liberty, will celebrate Mass at Baltimore’s historic Basilica of the National Shrine of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary on June 21 at 7 p.m. Cardinal Donald Wuerl of Washington DC will celebrate the closing Mass at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington at noon on July 4.

“The need for prayer, education, and action in defense of religious liberty has never been greater,” Archbishop Lori said in a statement issued by the USCCB. “The Fortnight for Freedom exists to meet that need. This year’s fortnight occurs just weeks before Aug. 1, when the (Obama) administration’s mandate coercing us to

violate our deeply held beliefs will be enforced against most religious non-profits. During the fortnight the Supreme Court’s decisions on the definition of marriage will likely be handed down as well.”

The Aug. 1 date mentioned by Archbishop Lori refers to the national deadline for religious organizations to comply with mandates from U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS). Other concerns, according to a USCCB statement, include pending legislation for immigration reform and humanitarian services.

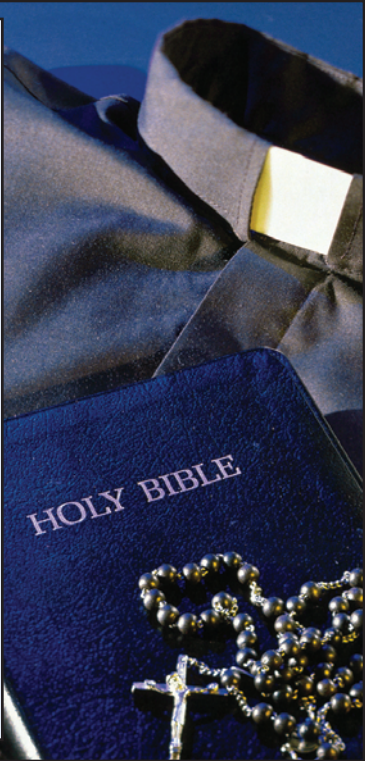

'A humanitarian issue with moral implications' NJ bishops lend their voices to call for immigration reform

(Editor's note: The following statement on immigration reform was issued May 23 by the Catholic Bishops of New Jersey, via the Trenton-based New Jersey Catholic Conference.)

New Jersey always has been a safe haven for immigrants seeking a better life. For well over a century, the Catholic Church in New Jersey has welcomed millions of individuals and families as they began new lives in our parishes. Today, as our Church continues to minister to hundreds of thousands of immigrants, we, the Catholic Bishops of New Jersey, lend our voice to the growing call for our government to enact comprehensive immigration reform.

As with all things, we begin by calling Catholics throughout the State to pause to pray for their brothers and sisters who have come to New Jersey as immigrants. Over the coming months, we will be joined by priests and deacons to speak out and preach on the importance of our nation addressing the moral issue of immigration reform.

We need to pray because of the failure of our current immigration policies. We need to pray because families are being divided, migrant workers are being exploited, and the most vulnerable of our brothers and sisters are being denied basic human rights. Clearly, comprehensive immigration reform is a humanitarian issue with moral implications.

Today we also speak out because our immigrant brothers and sisters are making significant contributions to our economy and especially to our parishes and reform at the federal level will enable even greater contributions to our nation's economic and cultural well being.

Most importantly, we speak out because Jesus told us that we will be judged by how well we fulfill our responsibility to feed the hungry, to give drink to the thirsty, to cloth the naked and to welcome the stranger (Matthew 25:35).

What should comprehensive reform include? In their 2003 pastoral letter, "Strangers No Longer: Together on the Journey of Hope," the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) outlined several principles for immigration reform. A decade later those principles still provide a foundation for immigration reform. Those principles include: a path to citizenship for the undocumented that is achievable, is set within a reasonable time frame, and includes the maximum number of persons; a system that protects the integrity of families; and a program that allows low-skilled migrant workers to enter and work in the United States legally and safely, providing them with the option to apply for permanent residency and eventual citizenship.

We thank the many parishes, religious communities and immigration service centers in our dioceses who strive daily and tirelessly to welcome the immigrant, and are poised to do even more. We thank civic communities who have widened their own circles of welcome. We thank members of Congress who work on a bi-partisan basis to break through barriers that are delaying action on immigration reform. Yes, we are thankful for what already is being done, but as a Church and a nation, we need to do much, much more.

What can Catholics do to support comprehensive immigration reform? Certainly, Catholics should be faithful to Jesus' call for His followers to welcome strangers and to more deeply practice hospitality. Catholics, and indeed all Christians, have an obligation to be informed on

the issues that relate to justice for immigrants

Most importantly, Catholics should pray for the safety and well-being of all the people living in our great nation including the undocumented.

Finally, we, the Catholic Bishops of New Jersey, ask our parishioners to contact their members of Congress and their two U.S. Senators to ask them to support comprehensive immigration reform.

Now is a time to take action to end how we treat so many of our brothers and sisters as virtual nonpersons. Now is a time to welcome brothers and sisters as strangers no more.

Church doesn't support amnesty, but says yes to 'earned legalization'

(Editor's note: The following question-and-answer summary is provided by New Jersey Catholic Conference, which is led by Deacon Patrick R. Brannigan, executive director.)

Why does the Catholic Church care about immigration policy?

Throughout our nation's history the Catholic Church has consistently welcomed and ministered to immigrants. A wonderful example is the story of the late-18th century Mission of Our Lady of the Rosary where vulnerable and poor young Irish women, arriving by ship in New York, were given safe shelter and job training.

Today, Catholic social service programs, schools and parishes continue that same outreach. In meeting immigrants face to face, the Catholic Church confronts firsthand the pain and problems resulting from a broken immigration policy. We cannot stand by in silence.

Does the Catholic Church support illegal immigration?

The Catholic Church does not support unlawful entry and/or circumvention of our nation's immigration laws. However, our nation's current immigration policy is broken and should be fixed. The Catholic Church supports a national solution that addresses the plight of undocumented immigrants with compassion.

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security reports that 11.5 million unauthorized persons have entered the United States. In large part, these individuals come in search of jobs in agriculture, construction and service industries. Many immigrants come from countries where the basic needs for family survival are difficult to obtain.

Does the Catholic Church support amnesty?

The Catholic Church does not support amnesty, but does support "earned legalization." Amnesty is commonly understood as a pardon or reward for those that did not follow immigration law, creating inequities for those who wait for legal entry.

Earned legalization would allow eligible individuals, already living in our communities and contributing to our nation, to find a path to citizenship. The earned legalization process might include payment of reasonable fines and back taxes, rigorous background checks and demonstrated proficiency in English.

What level of border enforcement do the bishops see as necessary and appropriate?

The Church recognizes the right of sovereign nations to protect and control their borders for the common good of all their citizens. However, prosperous nations, like the United States, have an obligation to serve the universal common good. Our nation should establish an immigration system that provides legal avenues for persons to enter the nation legally in a safe, orderly and dignified manner.

What can Catholics do to support comprehensive immigration reform?

First, Catholics should become better informed on the issues. A great deal of information is available at the Justice for Immigrants (JFI) Web site (posted above). The JFI Web site is a rich resource to assist parishes, schools and other organizations in discussions on the importance of immigration reform.

Most importantly, Catholics should pray for the safety and well-being of all the people living in our great nation including the undocumented.

Finally, Catholics should contact their members of Congress and their United States Senators to ask them to support comprehensive immigration reform.

Now is a time to take action to end how we treat so many of our brothers and sisters as virtual nonpersons. Now is a time to welcome brothers and sisters as strangers no more.

Archbishop issues call to assist Oklahoma

NEWARK—Archbishop John J. Myers has authorized an emergency voluntary collection at all masses in the Archdiocese of Newark to assist in relief services in the aftermath of the recent tornado disaster in Oklahoma. He also has asked Catholic schools within the archdiocese to under-

take a similar collection. All funds will be made available to Catholic Charities USA.

"When each of us began viewing the devastation that occurred in Moore, OK, recently, I am sure we thought of our own experiences here in New Jersey last fall when Superstorm Sandy hit,"

Archbishop Myers stated in his note to pastors and school principals. "Just as each of us in our own ways sought to reach out and help our neighbors in New Jersey during Sandy and its aftermath, we have again been called on to bring aid to those in need."

The archbishop urged parishioners and schools to remember the victims of this disaster in the general intercessions at masses.

Jesus and Elijah restore life

Readings: 1 Kings 17:17-24; Psalm 30; Galatians 1:11-19; Luke 7:11-17

"The Lord your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among you, from your brothers—him you shall heed" (Dt 18:15). This promise to Moses would be fulfilled in the coming of Elijah ("My God is Yah," the Lord) who confronted the weak and greedy king Ahab, whose Gentile wife Jezebel was the despotic power behind the throne.

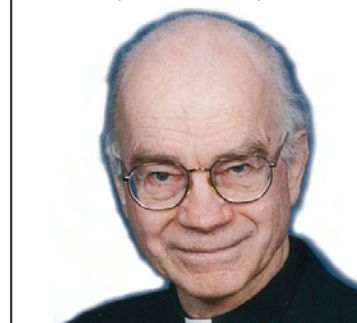
During a prolonged drought God guided Elijah into the foreign land north of Israel, where he encountered a famished widow gathering sticks to prepare a simple meal for herself and her son. To test her charity, Elijah asked for water and bread, assuring her that her food supply would not be exhausted. He was invited to be her house guest and all went well until her son became gravely ill. Had Elijah, recognized as a man of God, brought judgment on her for past sins? Indeed, at times our sins can cause illness and death, but there is always a cause-and-effect relationship. The idea that God arbitrarily punished a child for the parents' unrelated sin is contrary to biblical morality, so Elijah interceded and God restored the child to life.

Jesus used this example when He found that the people of Nazareth did not respond positively to His message. "Amen, I say to you, no prophet is accepted in his own country. But in truth I tell you, there were many widows in Israel in the days of Elijah, when the sky was shut up three years and six months, and a great famine came over all the land; Elijah was sent to none of these but only to Zarephath, in the land of Sidon, to a woman who was a widow" (Lk 4:25-26).

"Luke casts Jesus in the role of the prophet like Moses prom-

ised in Deut 18:15-18. This role is implied in the transfiguration scene... where the instruction given to the disciples by the heavenly voice, 'Listen to him' (9:35 echoes that of Deut 18:15.) Both Peter and Stephen applied this promise to Jesus" (Acts 3:22-23; 7:37) (Joseph A. Fitzmyer, Luke I-IX p 213).

The narrative about Jesus raising a dead person in today's Gospel provides an example of the works of the Messiah, in answer to John the Baptist's question: "Are you the one who is to come, or shall we look for another?" (Lk 7:20). From prison it seems that John was urging Jesus to begin the task of bringing judgment on the world, like Elijah who brought down fire from heaven (see Lk 9:54). However, Jesus looked to the promises of the prophets manifesting divine mercy to be the program of His work.

The Gospel of Luke show sensitivity to the plight of the poor, and who would seem threatened more than a widow whose only son had perished? Jesus came upon the funeral procession and expressed compassion for her. His words to her were followed by an action that might have been considered disruptive. But hearing the words "Do not weep," they

may have sensed that Jesus was showing deep concern. When the young man responded to the command of Jesus, they realized that His word was powerful.

A sense of awe swept over the crowd of mourners. They recognized that Jesus was like Elijah or another of the prophets, as the disciples declared when Jesus asked: "Who do the people say that I am?" (Lk 9:18-19). "God has visited His people!" This statement expressed the people's faith that the marvel they had witnessed would continue to resonate in their lives.

The restoration of the young man to his mother should have laid the foundation for a greater mutual appreciation and a constant reminder to the townsfolk of Jesus' visit among them. We may think ahead to the scene of Jesus' own death and John's record that He showed compassion to His own Mother. Because He was the only Son He designated the beloved disciple as Mary's spiritual child and provider (Jn 19:25-27).

Do we reach out to assist widows and widowers in our community? Often the friends and neighbors are very considerate in offering help immediately after a child's death. But as time goes on do we think to include these lonely persons in spiritual and social events of the community? Does the person have a ride to Sunday liturgy? Are there efforts to bring the sacraments to the homebound?

In some places a society of widows, under the patronage of Mary and Anna (Lk 2:36-38), has fostered the spiritual growth of those whose bereavement brings a common bond within the parish. The years after the death of a beloved husband should be enriched by prayer and fasting in the search to appreciate the ways in which God visits His people, especially the poor and mourners, in every generation.

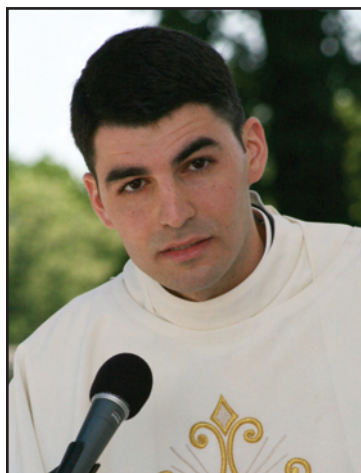

Caldwell confers doctoral degrees for ABA studies

CALDWELL—Denise Kerth and Eric Rozenblat made history at Caldwell College’s 71st commencement on May 11 when they were awarded the first Ph.D.s in the college’s history. The Class of 2013 had 450 other graduates.

College President Nancy H. Blattner presented Rozenblat of Oakland and Kerth, of Collingswood with doctoral degrees in applied behavior analysis (ABA). Caldwell College is a leader in autism education, developing the first master’s and first Ph.D. ABA programs in New Jersey.

Gulay Maffia, of Vernon, who received her master’s degree in special education learning disabilities teacher consultant, was one of two students to give commencement speeches. She shared her story of surviving the 9/11 attacks while working in New York and how that horror caused her to rethink her life’s direction.

“I felt that I had to do something better with my life for me, but also for those who perished,”

she said. Her parents were teachers and she knew “how they brought about change and made many people’s lives better as a result of their dedication.” Maffia decided to pursue teaching and today she teaches children with special needs. “Teaching is my way of fighting terrorism,” she declared.

Maffia urged graduates to “believe that the difficulties you may face along the way will only bring you great strength. Go out and find those who need your help and, along the way, carry peace in your heart and share it with everyone you come into contact with.”

Chelsea Loscalzo, of Bayside, NY, delivered the undergraduate commencement remarks. She received a bachelor’s degree in marketing. Loscalzo reminded her classmates that the professors at Caldwell College were a big part of their success and said that students could be assured that “what we’ve learned here has given us the right tools to move on to this next step of the journey.”
