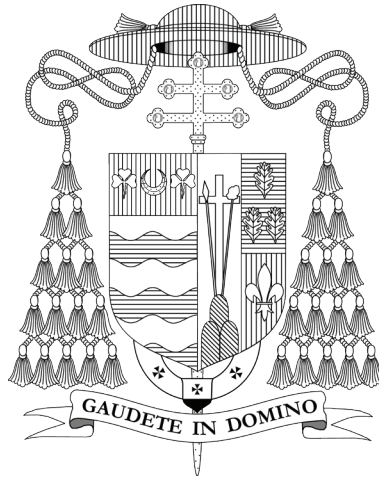

The Jubilee is the year of reconciliation, conversion, and sacramental penance and, consequently, of solidarity, hope, justice, and commitment to the service of God in joy and peace with one's brothers and sisters. It is called a "Holy Year", not only because it begins, takes place, and ends with solemn sacred rites, but also because it is intended to promote holiness of life. In fact, it has been established to consolidate faith, foster works of solidarity and fraternal communion within the Church and society, and to call and stimulate believers to a more sincere and consistent profession of faith in Christ, the only Savior. In the letter, the Pope helps us to understand the motto he has chosen for the coming jubilee, which is: "Pilgrims of Hope" and invites us to make 2024 a great "symphony of prayer".

Wanting to respond to the Pope's "*desiderata*", we thought of a proposal for consecrated persons that would combine the word hope with the word peace, having three concepts as a background:

- Commitment to the "least" - listening to the cry of the poor
- Care and custody of creation - protection of the environment
- Universal fraternity- solidarity

The title of the Jubilee of Consecrated Life will be "Pilgrims of hope, on the path to peace", precisely because it seems to us that peace is the strongest urgency of our time.

The Jubilee celebration for all consecrated men and women is indicated in the Jubilee calendar for 8 - 9 October 2025 through the visit and prayer at the tombs of Apostles Peter and Paul, passing through the Holy Door and, we hope, the meeting with the Holy Father. In the following days, until the Angelus on Sunday 12 October, we will experience the joy of communion: we will have times of sharing for the individual forms of consecrated life and times to be lived all together, to share and witness the beauty of our vocation in the world.

We entrust this journey to the Lord that it may bear fruit and take this opportunity to greet you fraternally in the Lord.

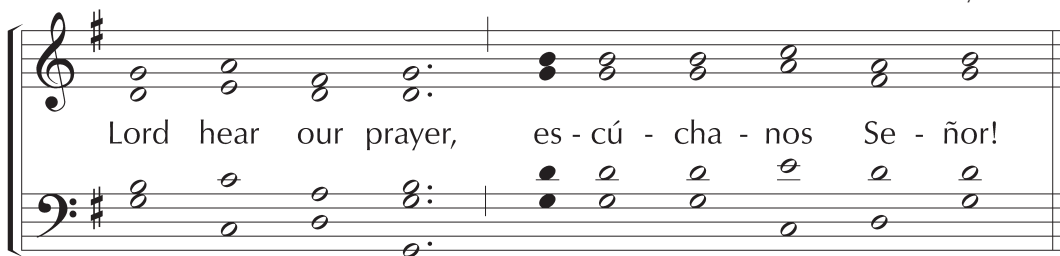
